In this issue we want to introduce you to the people behind St George Neighbourhood Partnership and how you could get involved.

St George Neighbourhood Partnership is managed by a group of residents, representatives from local community groups, local councillors, local businesses, representatives from Bristol City Council, Police and NHS Bristol.

The role of the steering group is to guide the partnership to respond to issues raised by local residents. We can call key agencies to account where services have failed or need improving and press for those failures or shortfalls to be made good. Using the issues raised by local residents at St George Neighbourhood Partnership public meetings we use your priorities to create an

### **Express your views!**

In this section we usually invite both local residents and agency representatives to express their views about the Neighbourhood Partnership. In this issue we have invited Police Sergeant Darren Warr to express his view about the Neighbourhood Partnership

PS Darren Warr says "We are working In Partnership to make St George a Safer, Stronger Neighbourhood"

Firstly let me introduce myself. I am the Police Sergeant for the community of St George East

and West and together with a team of police officers, police community support officers (PCSO's), Special Constables (volunteers) and support staff are your dedicated **Neighbourhood Policing** Team.



As a brief history, Neighbourhood policing teams came into effect across the country from April 2008 and signalled a new approach to reduce crime and

## What we have achieved together

By coming to the open public meetings or contacting the St George Neighbourhood Partnership with your priorities and voting on their importance, together we have made the following progress in improving our area:

#### Facilities for young people:

A government grant of £7,500 was awarded to the Speedwell and Hillfields area to provide youth activities on Friday and Saturday evenings. Outreach youth workers have started working in the Meadow Vale area one day a week. We have also seen an increase in the number of activities for young people in Bristol Brunel Academy. Some of these activities are advertised in the centre page. This is a great example of working together to benefit our neighbourhood! For further information on activities for young people please see pages 4-5.

#### **Road Safety:**

Residents expressed their concerns about people speeding in their neighbourhood and this was voted as a priority. Records have been checked and there are no details of any accidents. Speed recorders will be temporarily set up on the roads that you have identified and the results will be shared with you at our next Public Meeting on Wednesday 25th March 2009, 7pm to 9pm at St Aldans Church.

If the numbers show that there is a need to reduce speed then those roads will be added to the list to receive flashing 30 mph signs which have been shown to have good results on reducing drivers' speeds.

#### **Meadow Vale Community Centre:**

As many of you know a fantastic effort was made preparing and presenting a bid for lottery funding so this venue could benefit more people.

Unfortunately we were unsuccessful on this occasion. However, more work is being done

to identify new funding opportunities.

#### **Crime and safety:**

At our last open public meeting local residents have voted for there to be more visible police officers in Speedwell area, following a sustained period of ani-social behaviour.

In respond our local Neighbourhood Team put into place a specific operation, which saw an increase in the number of police patrols over the times of greatest calls connected to a Dispersal Order.

The local Neighbourhood Team have since the ending of the Dispersal order been joined by PCSO Michelle Green and PCSO Victoria Shields, to assist their respective communities of Speedwell/Whitehall and Two Mile Hill. Their contact details can be found on page 8. On behalf of the Neighbourhood Partnership we would like to congratulate them on their appointment and welcome them to St George.

We hope the partnership work between the police, local agencies and the community will continue to combat anti-social behaviour.

**Operation Torque**, to tackle nuisance motorbikes and scooters in Speedwell is still on-going. Any motorbike/scooters deemed to be causing nuisance will be confiscated by the police and will be destroyed.

It is important for parents to take an active, caring role in encouraging their children to behave responsibly on their scooters, both for their safety and that of others.

#### Who we are and what we do

## It's all about Community

In recent years 'community engagement' has become a top priority for her Majesty's Court Service (HMCS) and the agencies that come under the umbrella of the Criminal Justice System (CJS). The vital role that residents play in their local communities can never be underestimated and when it comes to working together, everyone from the Police to HMCS truly value the huge steps forward that have already been made.

A recent Public Open meeting at the New Brunel Academy in Speedwell brought residents together with the Police Service, HMCS Magistrates' and legal professionals, the Crown Prosecution Service (CPS), and the Probation Service.

The purpose of the meeting was not merely to pay lip service to residents; but to openly discuss local criminal issues that often have a significant and very negative impact upon a community.

These meetings are not a quick fix, but they are an important tool for building understanding and trust and as a method to demystify what is frequently seen as a remote and inexplicable system.

HMCS, the Police and the CJS are committed to building lasting relationships with the residents of St. George and Speedwell. By doing so it gives Magistrates the opportunity to further understand the impact of offending on local people and how sentencing itself can affect a community.

## St George NP Fund

When Bristol City Council introduced the roll out of Neighbourhood Partnerships across the city, the council allocated a nominal budget of £5,000 per ward to each Neighbourhood Partnership. The aim of this money is not to deliver services or replace mainstream funds but to help local Neighbourhood Partnerships achieve quick wins to improve their local area. Funds received could potentially be spent on anything providing it is deemed reasonable and legal to do so! St George Neighbourhood Partnership received £10,000 to spend in 2008/9 financial year. This is £5,000 for St George East and £5,000 for St George West.

During the 2008/9 financial year the steering group worked hard in developing the Action Plan based on your priorities and used this to guide them on spending the money. Money had to be allocated by end of March 2009, otherwise it would have been clawed back into Bristol City Council's central funds.

So far money has been spent on tree planting/replacement, a priority from first public meeting, a Community Fun Day in Meadowvale Park, publicising the need to vote for the Meadowvale Community Association's Lottery bid, printing the last newsletter and improving the local area. This expenditure was all in response to priorities raised at public meetings. A full financial report will be given in our next Public Meeting so please come along to hear about these projects and how you can have a say in how to allocate funds from this year's budget.

Good news! The budget for 2009/10 financial year has doubled. £10,000 for each ward means that the St George Neighbourhood Partnership has been allocated £20,000 to use to meet the priorities you identify for St George. We are also pleased to hear that the clawback of any unspent money to central funds has been sensibly reconsidered by BCC so any unspent monies will be carried forward to 2009/10 financial year.

## Speedwell Pride Project (SPP)

Residents in Speedwell often regard Speedwell As you can see the Speedwell Pride Project as a neglected community with very little is shaping up. We want to give young peoprovision. SPP is an ambitious project. The partnership is teaming up with local services to turn Speedwell into an area of which we can all be proud. We are planning to carry out provements, possibly some tasteful graffiti. environmental improvements, some of which include:

- Promoting a Gardening Competition
- Helping local residents who needs assistance with their gardens
- Hanging baskets in prime locations
- Deep cleaning in front of shopping areas

the fear of crime in communities to build Safer, Stronger Neighbourhoods.

During our daily work your Neighbourhood team will be dealing with a wide range of policing matters in your community together with responding to requests for assistance. We recognise that you, the local people, want more say in the issues we deal with in St George and how we deal with these issues. By you having an influence on policing in your neighbourhood we will, by finding local solutions to these local problems through close partnership working and community involvement, make your community Safer and Stronger.

Involvement within the St George Neighbourhood Partnership enables us, in addition to working closely with, council services, key local agencies, volunteers such as Neighbourhood Watches, to identify with the community at regular public open meetings what matters most to them and then work through the partnership to jointly solve the issue.

This new approach is called Partners and Communities Together (PACT) and gives you the chance to influence the policing priorities in your neighbourhood.

What is your local priority? Contact any of your Neighbourhood Team, register it on the Avon and Somerset Web site, attend one of the forthcoming open meetings or by any one of the other methods available such as attending one of your local police surgeries.
